Governance – legal Obligation

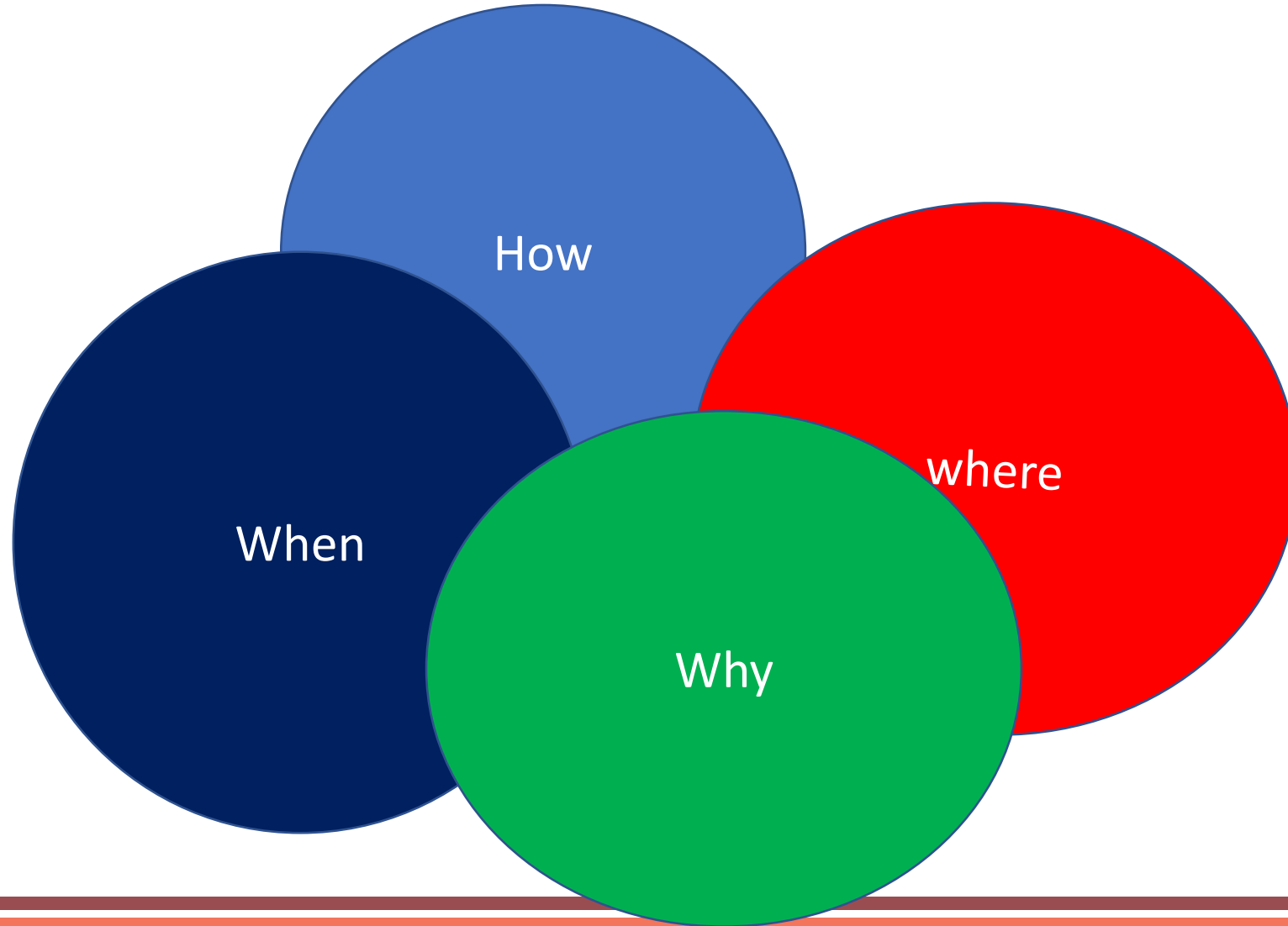
Code of Conduct- Medical / Nursing body (Professional registration)

Trust- Unspoken / disclosure

Documentations – Secure transferring and storage of personal and sensitive information

Why do you counsel

- Check client / couples pre counselling knowledge
- Build up knowledge
- Offer / cascade family screening
- Dispel myths
- Check cultural beliefs

How do we counsel ? Non directive vs directive

With the couple or one parent present

Prenatal screening – use of visual aids, information leaflets.

What do you have in place currently



When / Where do we counsel?

In the hospital post delivery

At a home visit

On the 1st clinic appointment

Is the appointment with the nurse or medical doctor

Is there a scope to give results sooner?



Breaking bad News

- No news is good news terminology has no place in genetic counselling!
- Giving bad news should be done in a sensitive manner
- At the right time
- In a conducive environment
- Use of appropriate language
- Allow time for client / patient to process the information
- Silence is acceptable
- Reflection
- Next step

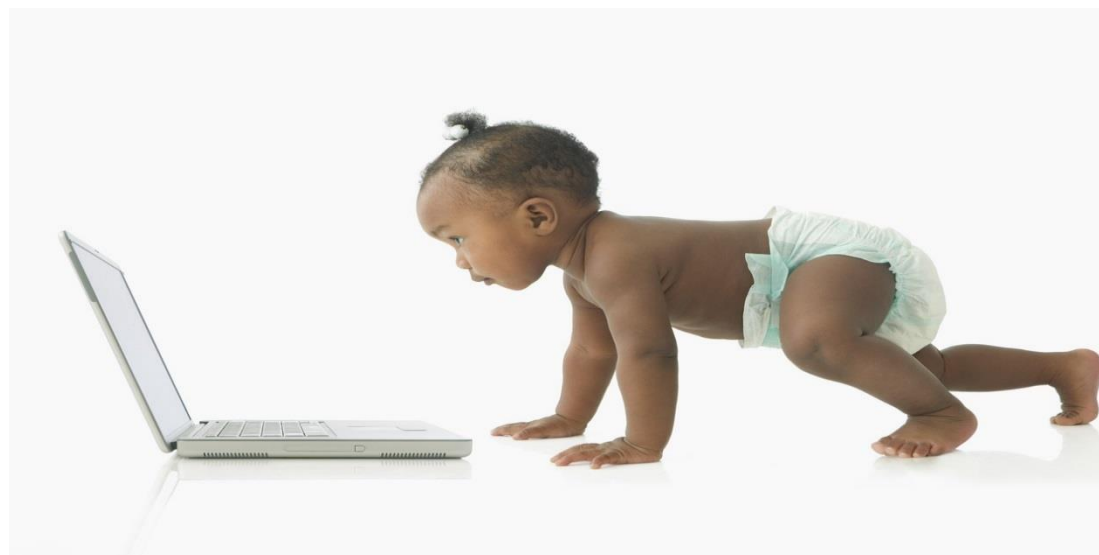
